Bill is the past Chairperson of the Hillsborough County Domestic Violence Fatality Review Team and is the current President of the National Institute of Crime Prevention.

**Rod Reder Vice President, CFO NICP** was with the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office in Tampa Fl. for 29 years. He was most recently assigned as a Deputy District Commander. Rod was previously the Crimes Against Persons supervisor, and was the Domestic Violence Coordinator for the Sheriff's Office for seven years. He has taught for Florida State University, the University of South Florida and the U.S. Army. Rod is recognized nationwide as an expert in domestic violence by the U.S. Department of Defense and the U. S. Department of Justice. He has received numerous awards such as the Florida Governor's "Peace at Home Award". Rod is the Vice President of the National Institute of Crime Prevention. Rod is a graduate of the 109th session of the Southern Police Institute, University of Louisville. Rod is Past Board Chairman of the Family Justice Center -Hillsborough County and served on the Florida Attorney General's statewide Fatality Review Team. Rod has a Bachelor's degree from the University of South Florida in Tampa.
